Teaching and playing tips

Don't extend your index finger on the marimba mallet when playing. It prevents the beaters from naturally bouncing and will be very difficult to roll easily and fast.

Tips for care and maintenance

Whenever you think "is this okay for my marimba" think: "is this okay for my grand piano." We too often find coffee mug stains on marimba notes but do not find coffee mug stains on grand pianos.

Note tuning, like piano tuning, is an ongoing maintenance procedure one needs to do to all models of African marimbas. Wood is a living entity and will expand in the heat and contract in the cold. If your marimbas are used regularly and exposed to various elements, your notes will eventually need to be tuned. We recommend that our clients get their notes retuned once a year depending on how often they are used.

School Highlight

School: Clifton School

Teacher: Mr Stéphane Pechoux (College), Mrs Jane Magner (Senior Prep) and Ms Londiwe Mbuli (Foundation Phase) **Location:** Morningside, Durban, KZN



At Clifton in Durban, we are fortunate to have built up a wide range of traditional African percussion instruments in our music department over the years from various sources, and we incorporate these widely into our class music curriculum.

We have 2 sets of Marimbas: One set is allocated for our boys in the College and one set for our Prep; the latter set acquired from The Marimba Workshop. In the College, we have traditional African marimbas- soprano, alto, tenor and bass, but in the prep, we work with diatonic combination 3,5 octave marimbas and bass marimbas- much more fun as more boys per marimba means more playing with friends and more fun! In the classroom, we find that this best suits the way that parts can be arranged in groups to mirror

age-appropriate ability and other stages of learning in the music curriculum according to grade and age. As the boys get older and move into four part harmony, the marimbas can then, at times, potentially be a practical application of this.

It is no surprise that our boys are drawn to marimbas. Growing boys are physical and active beings, and playing percussion instruments mirror strength and boisterous, energetic play in the musical sphere. This allows boys to freely express and empower themselves through music in a way that is intrinsically 'boy', and they love it!

Making music with your friends, and forging new friendships through making music together as a team, also makes boys look forward to marimbas with enthusiasm and excitement each week. The versatility of what can be played (anything from Mozart to Maroon 5!), along with the ease through which to learn tunes quickly in early stages, also grows boys' confidence in themselves and makes music ensemble playing very accessible, and most importantly, lots of fun!

For the co-curricular marimba bands, we use our well-loved and versatile Marimba Workshop Marimbas. Co-curricular Marimbas at Clifton has grown exponentially -from an SP Band of 7 boys in 2018 (known affectionately as our "founding fathers" of marimbas at Clifton!), we now have two bands in the Senior Primary phase (Grade 4 and 5, and Grade 6 and 7), and one College Marimba Band (Grade 8-12) which often collaborates with our College Drumline. We also have a marimba 'club' in the Foundation Phase, to introduce boys to the great fun of making music on marimbas. We have also extended our marimba music-making to our Clifton community, running some fun staff workshops and Parents' Marimba mornings too.

Our Marimba band boys perform frequently at school functions- whether music concerts or general events in the life of the school- as well as at other concerts around Durban. Most recently, both SP Marimba Bands enjoyed a successful music tour to the KZN Midlands a few weeks back. Along with our SP Choir and SP Orchestra, the boys loved the experience of visiting different schools and sharing their music with others. The Grade 6 and 7 Band also took part in the 2021 Education Africa Virtual Marimba Festival, and we hope to expose our boys to more opportunities such as this going forward.

It is a privilege to explore and enjoy the wide range of possibilities that comes with making music together on these wonderful instruments. Marimbas are a firm favourite here at Clifton, and we look forward to growing and developing our marimba music programme even further in the years to come.
